
## NOTICE REGARDING CONSTRUCTION WASTE AT DPW YARD


In response to a growing number of contractors and others involved in the home remodeling and real estate market, the Township has observed an unsustainable increase in the delivery of construction debris being delivered to our yard.

Effective April 1, 2017, per direction of the Township Council, the DPW will no longer receive any construction debris except as follows:

1. Residents undertaking modest repairs and improvements to their primary residence will be able to bring a small amount of construction waste to the DPW no more than 2 times per year.
2. The total volume of material shall not exceed 2 cubic yards of material. This is equal to approx. one standard pick-up truck level load.
3. The Township will only receive these materials on Saturdays and Mondays between 8 am and 12pm and the drop will be logged by name and address by DPW staff.
4. The Township will not accept the material from a contractor unless the resident accompanies the contractor to coordinate disposal. Proof of work being done by the contractor will be required by providing a copy of the job proposal, invoice or related job paperwork. Must also comply with all other requirements stated.
5. Loose debris, such as broken drywall, tile or roofing shingles, must be bagged or containerized for disposal. Long items, such as framing lumber, trim pieces or flooring material, must be cut down in lengths not exceeding 4 ft.
6. Commercial vehicles as explained in item #4, trailers or any larger size vehicles, such as a moving van, will be kept to the load limit requirement explained in item #2.

*Residents are encouraged to investigate and make use of options such as dumpster services, Bagster disposal or other debris removal services for the handling of waste generated during construction projects.*
