PROPERTY TAX DUE DATES AND PAYMENT OPTIONS

The Evesham Township Tax Collector's Office is ready to help residents understand due dates, payment options and more.

Quarterly Due Dates

As a reminder, municipal property taxes are due quarterly.

- First Quarter Due Date: February 1
- Second Quarter Due Date: May 1
- Third Quarter Due Date: August 1
- Fourth Quarter Due Date: November 1

Remember, there's a 10-day grace period for each payment. If the 10th falls on a weekend or holiday, you have until the next business day to pay without penalty. Payments not received by the end of the grace period will begin accruing interest dating back to the due date.

When to Expect Your Tax Bills

Residents will receive two bills per year. The first bill, mailed in mid-June, covers the third-quarter payment. A final bill, mailed in mid-September, includes the fourth quarter payment of the current year, as well as the first two quarter payments of the following year.

Easy Ways to Pay

Choose the option that works best for you!

- Online: Pay safely and securely from home using the township's online payment system. Find the link on The Tax Collector's page on our township website at www.evesham-nj.org. This service can also be used to setup automatic payments for the future.
- Drive-Up Drop Box: Our secure drop box is located in the circular drive at the main entrance of the Evesham Township Municipal Building at 984 Tuckerton Road.
- Mail or In-Person: Visit us or mail your payment to the Tax Collector's Office at 984 Tuckerton Road, Marlton, NJ 08053. Reminder: Post-marks are not accepted as "received date".

INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND



Evesham Township proudly continues design work for a new, Completely Inclusive Playground at Evesboro Downs Park that will be designed specifically for the needs of children and adults who experience disabilities.

The project is the result of a \$731,000 grant awarded through the 2024 New Jersey Green Acres Funding program, under the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

This funding is supported by New Jersey's "Jake's Law", which prioritizes and incentivizes applications to the Green Acres Program that seek funding for inclusive playgrounds.

As noted by Mayor Jaclyn Veasy, the

township is incredibly grateful to all partners at the State level for recognizing the importance of inclusive play in the Evesham community.

"This new Completely Inclusive Playground will not only provide a fun and engaging space for all children and their families, but it will also stand as a testament to our township's continued dedication to inclusivity and accessibility," Mayor Veasy said. "This grant underscores the municipality's commitment to serving individuals who experience disabilities and enhancing recreational opportunities for residents of all needs."

The new playground will be designed with standards that not only meet, but also generally exceed, those set by the Americans with Disabilities Act.

- In the event of an emergency, always dial 911.
- For non-emergent situations, questions, and concerns, please call our direct line at 856-983-1111. The phone number is staffed by police department personnel Monday-Friday, 8am-4pm. The phone number is answered by Burlington County Central Communications personnel after-hours, weekends, and holidays. The call-taker will connect you to one of our officers.
- The agency offers a Confidential Phone Tip-Line for sharing non-emergent information anonymously at 856-983-4699.
- The agency offers a confidential texting tip service through Tip411. Information can be shared anonymously by texting the letters "ETPD TIP" to 847411 on any mobile device.
- The agency offers an Online Reporting option for certain non-emergent incidents and situations

Safe Exchange Zone

Searching for the very best deals often times leads people to the Internet, where online predators can be waiting for their next victim.

That's why ETPD encourages our residents to take full advantage of our "Safe Transaction Zone" for purchases from online yard-sale type sites.

The safe transaction zones were created to help protect our citizens as robberies, thefts and scams become more prevalent with online transaction sites.

The zone has been set up in the lobby of the Evesham Township Police Headquarters at 984 Tuckerton Road, Marlton NJ. The lobby and surrounding parking lots are well-lit and monitored by state-of-the-art surveillance system.

Members of the Evesham Police Department will not participate in transactions or act as witnesses. Our employees are not available for legal advice or allowed to settle disputes between parties involved in transactions occurring in our facilities. Transactions involving weapons, drugs or drug paraphernalia are barred from the zones.

Vacation Checks

The Evesham Police Department offers vacation house checks as a complimentary service to the citizens of Evesham. The Evesham Police Department will conduct periodic checks of your residence while you are out of town, for a period of up to 21 days.

This program has been tremendously successful over the years. It provides the Police Department an extra set of eyes in our neighborhoods to look after the homes of our residents who are on vacation- an all-too-common target for burglars. It also provides you, the homeowner, some extra peace of mind so you can focus on enjoying your vacation, having a successful business trip, or whatever takes you away from home, instead of worrying about how things are back at your house.

Autism Disabilities Registry

The Evesham Township Police Department has established a registry program for individuals with Autism or Disabilities, in efforts to give police quick access in an emergency to critical information about a person who is registered.

The registry can provide police with emergency contact information, detailed physical descriptions, known routines, favorite attractions or special needs of an individual with autism disorder, or other disabilities such as: Alzheimer's, Dementia, Down Syndrome or any other endangered individuals.

A sticker has been created that can be placed on your vehicle or near the main entrance to your home that will alert an approaching Police Officer that someone inside could have a special need.

Individuals can also obtain a seatbelt sleeve that will warn a First Responder during an incident, such as a motor vehicle crash, that the occupant has Autism and may not respond.

The seatbelt sleeves and stickers are free to our residents, upon completing the registration.

The "Blue Envelope" program was established in an effort to avoid misunderstandings between our officers and drivers that have autism spectrum disorder. They aim to make a traffic stop or motor vehicle accident safe for all involved parties.

This envelope will hold their driver's license, vehicle registration card, vehicle insurance card, and an emergency contact card inside the blue envelope, along with instructions for the driver in case they are unsure what to do when being pulled over. This envelope also tells the officers the best form of communication, like simplifying requests, or how to react if the driver becomes upset. It also holds the driver's emergency contact card. A check box on the top of the card will also indicate whether the driver is verbal or nonverbal.

Project Medicine Drop Box

Project Medicine Drop Box is installed at the Evesham Police Department, in the lobby area, which provides a safe way for the town's residents to dispose of unused medications. In 2021, over 800 pounds of unused and expired medications were disposed of in Project Medicine Drop box.



Members of the public are invited to visit the Project Medicine Drop site and drop off any unused prescription medications anonymously and with no questions asked. Our Project Medicine Drop site makes this service available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

Project Medicine Drop is an important component of the New Jersey Attorney General's effort to stop the diversion and abuse of prescription drugs, including highly addictive opiate painkillers.

Hypodermic needles and epi-pens are not accepted. Medical facilities are also not permitted to utilize the drop box.

#9pmRoutine

Five minutes every night can save you hours, days, weeks, months, or years of heartache. Set your phone alarm for 9 p.m. every night and join us in the #9pmroutine.

- Lock all ground floor doors and windows.
- Make sure valuables are not visible from outside the home.
- Remove valuables from vehicle and lock them. Remember to close your garage doors, too.
- Empty mailboxes and retrieve packages from your porch.

9 p.m. Routine

The 9 p.m. Routine is a nightly practice designed to enhance home and vehicle security by encouraging individuals to take specific safety measures before bedtime.

9 p.m. Routine messages and memes are posted on our social media outlets on a regular basis to remind individuals to secure their homes and vehicles, as the vast majority of thefts occur to properties and vehicles that are unlocked.

FINANCE 2025 Budget

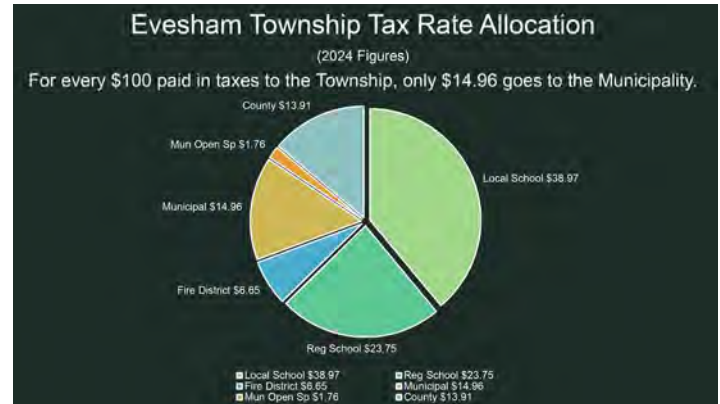
Earlier this year Evesham Township Council adopted the 2025 Municipal Budget and 2025 Capital Budget.

This 2025 budget includes numerous investments to enhance Evesham's facilities, roads, equipment and staffing to ensure Evesham residents continue to receive the excellent level of services that members of our community have come to expect.

Just some highlights include funding for the following:

- The 2025 Road Program, including: Brower Court, Defense Drive, Fox Chase Drive, Jay Court, Kings Grant Drive (North), North Elmwood Road, Posterity Place, Tylor Lane and Yale Road
- Four New Police Vehicles and Police Equipment
- Police Department Facility Improvements
- Tennis and Basketball Court improvements at Memorial Field
- Dek Hockey installation at Evesboro Downs
- New Automated Sanitation Unit
- Improvements to the Entrance/Elevator at the Gibson House Community Center
- Staffing enhancements for the Public Works and Parks Departments
- Improvements to the Thomas and Mary Evans House to allow the facility to remain a viable location for arts programs
- Lighting Upgrades for Main Street
- Lighting Upgrades Kings Grant Drive/Crown Royal Parkway
- Preliminary Engineering for Artificial Turf Field at the M3 Field at the Memorial Sports Complex

This year's budget also begins to transition the municipality to a model over the next several years where the township will now be responsible for the full funding of the School Resource Officer (SRO) program with the Evesham Township School District (ETSD).



Historically, the cost of this program was shared in different ways between the Township and the ETSD. Going forward, the township will eventually assume full financial responsibility for the program, ensuring the continued presence of officers in ETSD schools and relieving the district of that expense.

This year's budget was also the first where the township could legally anticipate revenue from local cannabis retailers, based on the revenue received in 2024. The township expects that revenue to increase year over year moving forward in future budgets.

As noted by Mayor Jaclyn Veasy, the investments in this year's budget reflect areas that she and her fellow members of Council hear most about from residents, specifically on the topics of repairing streets and roads, feeling safe in our community with a dynamic and well-prepared police force, and enhancing parks and open space.

"I'm proud of this budget and how it reflects the wants and needs of our residents. We've done a great deal of planning over the past several years, and we're starting to see that planning come to fruition for our residents with these investments into our community and our workforce," Mayor Veasy said. "We're constantly updating our plans to ensure we're meeting what residents want to see. These plans are ever evolving and ever changing, but we're always continuing to listen and invest."

2026 TOWNSHIP COUNCIL REORGANIZATION MEETING

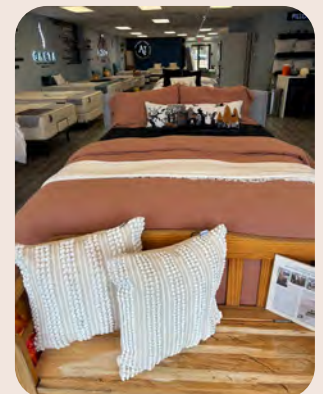
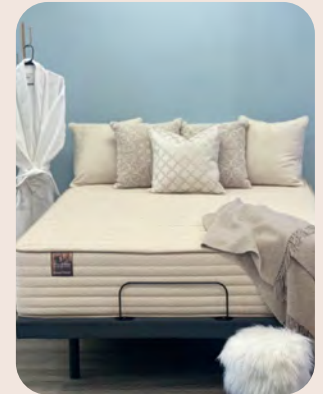

Bulk items should be placed curbside by 6 a.m. on the Monday of the designated week listed above. All items will be collected by the end of that week.

Don't Know Your Zone? It's easy! Your bulk collection week is based on your regular weekly trash day:

- **Zone 1:** Monday trash day
- **Zone 2:** Tuesday trash day
- **Zone 3:** Wednesday trash day
- **Zone 4:** Thursday trash day

When to Put it Out: Please place your items curbside by 6 a.m. on the Monday of your designated week. We'll get everything by the end of that week!

What's Accepted: We'll take items like furniture, mattresses, extra trash cans, and bagged trash.

What About Other Items? Not everything is a "bulk" item. Here's a quick guide for common items you might be tossing:

- **Metal Items:** Washers, dryers, grills, and other metal items do not go with bulk trash. But Public Works will pick them up for free! Just call Public Works at (856) 983-2798 x6910 to get on the schedule for the monthly metal pickup. You can also schedule through a link on the township website at www.evesham-nj.org under the page for the Public Works Department.
- **Electronics:** TVs, computers, and anything with a plug or battery are considered electronics and need to be disposed of separately at The Public Works Yard.
- **Yard Waste:** Leaves, grass clippings, and brush are not included.
- **Hazardous Materials:** Hazardous materials, such as paint, pesticides and motor oil are not included in bulk. Residents can deposit small amounts of household hazardous waste items at the Evesham Public Works Yard on the first Saturday of each month from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- **Construction Debris:** Construction Debris, such as any remodeling/building materials, roofing materials, carpets, flooring, fencing and pressure treated wood. Residents may bring small amounts of construction debris from residential projects only to the Public Works Yard on Saturdays and Mondays between 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- **Pressure Treated Wood:** Pressure Treated Wood contains hazardous chemicals. State law prohibits this wood from being collected with bulk trash. Residents may bring small amounts of pressure treated wood to the Public Works Yard on Saturdays and Mondays between 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- **Tires:** (up to five) may be brought to the Public Works yard for disposal for a nominal fee. Tires may be disposed of Monday through Saturday between 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- **Used Clothes & Textiles:** Used clothes, textiles, shoes, belts, purses, curtains, bedding can be dropped off at the Public Works Yard. Receipts available.

Year-Round Disposal: Remember, you can also drop off bulk trash or any of the items listed above at the Public Works Facility at 100 Sharp Road, Monday-Saturday, from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. (or during special times/days as listed)

Evesham Township also offers residents a **Special Bulk-Pickup trash collection service for a fee** to accommodate residents who wish to dispose of bulk trash at a time outside of a regularly scheduled, quarterly collection period.

Pizza Box Guidelines

Pizza boxes must be clean and empty. A **small** amount of grease is okay.

Pizza boxes that look like this **CAN** be recycled.

DO NOT recycle pizza boxes that look like this.

GOT A STREETLIGHT OUT? HERE'S WHAT TO DO!

Notice a streetlight that's out or needs a repair? You can help get it fixed fast by reporting it directly to the utility company that maintains it. This is usually the same company that provides electricity to your home.

How to Report a Streetlight Issue

- 1. Find Your Utility:** Evesham has two electricity providers: PSE&G and Atlantic City Electric.
- 2. Gather Info:** When you call or go online to report the issue, have these details ready: The nearest street address and intersecting street. The pole number (you can find this on a metal tag attached to the pole).
- 3. Make the Call:** PSE&G: Report an outage call (800) 436-7734 or online at nj.pseg.com/outageandgasleaks Atlantic City Electric: Report an outage call (800) 642-3780 or online at www.atlanticcityelectric.com/outages

Snow Season is on the Way! Here's What to Know About Plowing in Our Township

When the snow starts to fall, our Public Works crews are ready to roll. We want to keep our streets safe and clear for everyone, and a little bit of teamwork goes a long way. Here's a look at how we tackle snow removal and what you can do to help.

Our Plowing Process

- **When do we start?** Plowing operations generally begin when two inches of snow have accumulated, or sooner if the Police Department determines that roads are becoming hazardous.
- **How long does it take?** We have roughly 350 lane miles of streets and many cul-de-sacs to cover. Our trucks focus on primary streets first, then move to secondary roads. A single truck typically needs about 6-8 hours to complete its route. For heavy, sustained storms, trucks will need to make many passes to keep roads passable.
- **A note on cul-de-sacs:** These can be tricky! Cul-de-sacs with a center island can take around 15-20 minutes to clear, while those without islands can take up to 30 minutes or more. In heavy snow, a front-end loader may assist in these areas.

Tips to Help Plowing Operations

We do our best to clear streets as efficiently as possible, but we need your help to make sure our crews can work safely and effectively.

- **Don't shovel or blow snow back into the street.** After a plow has gone by, please don't push snow from your driveway or sidewalk back onto the street. This is a major safety hazard and is prohibited by town ordinance. Instead, pile snow on your lawn or the plant strip next to your curb.
- **Park off the street.** When it starts to snow, please move your vehicle into your driveway. This protects your car from being hit with slush and salt and helps our plows get a clear path.
- **Check your mailbox.** Make sure your mailbox and post are in good repair and are not leaning into the street where they could be damaged by a plow.
- **Clear snow from fire hydrants.** If there's a fire hydrant in front of your home, please try to clear the snow around it. This could save valuable time for our emergency services.

- **Move portable basketball hoops.** Please remove any portable basketball hoops from the street or the right-of-way. We are not responsible for damage to items left in the path of snow removal equipment.
- **Move Refuse/Recycling Carts.** Avoid putting carts in street as this creates a hazard to vehicles, including plow trucks.

Understanding Snow at the End of Your Driveway and Corners

We know it's frustrating to find a pile of snow at the end of your driveway after the plow has gone by. This is not done on purpose! There is no practical way for a plow to "cut off" the snow as it crosses a driveway. This is especially true in cul-de-sacs, where space is limited and all the snow on the roadway must be pushed to the outer edge. In addition, it is important to understand that it is the Public Works responsibility to clear Township roads and make them as accessible as possible for emergency services and safe travel. Unfortunately, responding to residential requests for assistance with impacted driveway aprons is simply not feasible.

A helpful tip: To reduce the amount of snow that gets pushed into your driveway, try to pile the snow from your driveway on the right side as you face the street.

Similarly, snow is often piled high at street corners. Our plows push snow in the direction they are traveling to properly clear the street radius for turns. Please remember to keep children from climbing on these piles, especially at school bus stops, as they can be dangerous.

Need to Report a Hazard?

If you see a hazard after plowing operations have ended (like excessive ice or a plowed-in bus stop), please call us.

- **During business hours (Monday-Friday, until 4 p.m.):** Call the Public Works Department at **(856) 983-2798 x6910**.
- **After hours or on weekends:** Call the Police Department's non-emergency number at **(856) 983-1111**.

Leaving a message at any other municipal office could cause delays. By using these direct numbers, you help us respond to issues as quickly as possible.

NOTE: State roads are not plowed by Evesham Township.

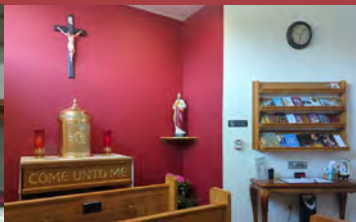

Do I Need A Permit For A Shed?

All sheds require a Zoning Permit. Depending on the size of the structure, a Building Permit might also be required. If you are part of an HOA, you will first require HOA approval. Learn more about erecting a shed.

Do I Need A Permit For A Fence?

A Zoning Permit is required for a fence. If the fence

surrounds a pool, a Building Permit is also required, and it must meet the pool barrier code. You'll need a copy of your property survey, and if you are part of a homeowners association, you will need their approval first. For more details, review Chapter 160-22 of the Evesham Township Code online.

I Have Heard That My Property Or The Property I Am Interested In Is In The "Pinelands". What Does That Mean? How Do I Know If The Property I Am Interested In Is In The Pinelands Area Of The Township?

The New Jersey Pinelands Commission is an independent state agency whose mission is to "preserve, protect, and enhance the natural and cultural resources of the Pinelands National Reserve, and to encourage compatible economic and other human activities consistent with that purpose."

VITAL STATISTICS OFFICE TYING THE KNOT

If wedding bells are in your future, the Evesham Vital Statistics Office is here to help guide couples with this happy endeavor and the necessary state regulations.

To Qualify For A Marriage License In Evesham Township

At least one member of the couple (ages 18+) must be an Evesham resident, OR a couple that resides out-of-state who intends to have their ceremony in Evesham Township (If a couple's ceremony is to take place outside of New Jersey, they will need to contact the registrar in the state/country where said ceremony will occur)

Meet With A Registrar - Mandatory Appointment And License Required Before You Say "I Do"

Couples looking to "tie-the-knot" are required to meet with a certified Municipal Registrar to obtain their necessary legal license before saying "I Do".

Happy couples may contact the Vital Records Office to arrange their appointment at (856) 988-4429, Monday through Thursday, 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. (closed Fridays).

(Note: New Jersey State Law also mandates a **72-hour waiting period between the time couples apply and when their license is legally issued**)

Items Required At The Appointment:

- **Completed (first page only) Application Form** available on the Township website under the Vital Records Department
- **One Witness** with a valid government-issued photo ID or passport, over the age of 18, who will attest to your information.
- **Couple's IDs:** each applicant must provide a valid government-issued photo ID or passport.
- **Applicant's Proof of Residency:** document(s) showing your current address from the last three months (i.e. a utility bill, bank statement, or pay stub).
- **Officiant's Contact Information:** phone number of the officiant who will be performing your ceremony.
- **\$28.00 application fee: cash or a check only.**

PET LICENSING A VITAL "RABIES REPELLANT"

Keeping your dog or cat's license up-to-date keeps both our pets and our whole community safe from exposure to rabies, which is a serious and potentially lethal illness. The purpose of licensing your cat and dog in Evesham is to ensure that pets in our community have current rabies vaccinations. Also, collected licensing fees are used for both the township's rabies clinics and the township's animal control services.

LICENSE YOUR PET AND STAY SAFE!

Per Township Code, cat and dog owners are required to license their pet(s) annually by January 31st. Starting January 2, 2026, residents may license their pets in person or via mail accordingly:

- **Walk-in:** Visit the Clerk's Office at 984 Tuckerton Road - Room 201, Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Required documents:

- Your pet's most recent rabies vaccination certificate (the **expiration date must fall after November 1, 2026**)
 - Proof of spaying or neutering (if applicable)
 - Payment by cash or check only
- Mail-in: Download and complete the license application form from the township website under the Clerk's department > Forms & Documents > Clerks Office forms

Required documents:

- Completed application form (per pet)
- Copy of your pet's rabies and spaying/neutering certificate (the expiration date must fall after November 1, 2026)

- Payment (by check or money-order payable to "Township of Evesham")
- Self-addressed stamped return envelope

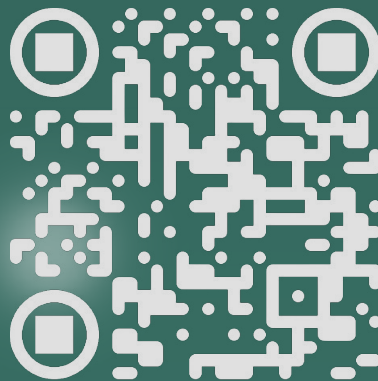

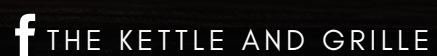

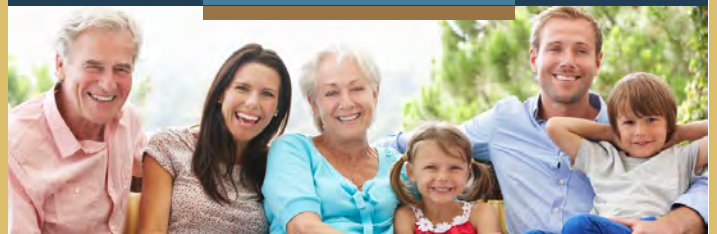
