I often think about the process that has led us here.

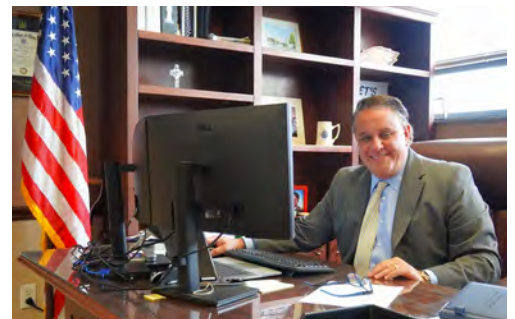

## HELP PREVENT PROPERTY FRAUD: SIGN UP FOR BURLINGTON COUNTY'S FREE PROPERTY FRAUD ALERT SYSTEM

Property fraud is a growing white-collar crime where scammers forge documents to transfer property titles into their own names.

To combat this issue, the Burlington County Clerk's Office offers a free early warning system for all residents through [www.propertyfraudalert.com/NJBurlington](http://www.propertyfraudalert.com/NJBurlington)

This free subscription service that notifies residents via email, text, or phone whenever a document (like a deed, lien, or mortgage) is recorded in Burlington County using a resident's name.

Just enter your personal and/or business name and you will be notified when a document is recorded with your name match.

While Property Fraud Alert does not prevent fraud from happening; it provides an early warning system for property owners to take appropriate actions should they determine possible fraudulent activity has taken place.

Remember – anybody can be a victim of identity theft. Fraudsters often target seniors, owners of vacant land, or vacation homes. By the time a homeowner discovers the fraud, the damage can be difficult and expensive to reverse. This system allows you to act the moment a suspicious document is filed.

## INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUND

Exciting news! The new, completely inclusive playground at Evesboro Downs Park is nearing the start of construction! Equipment is currently scheduled for delivery to Evesham Township by the end of March, with installation beginning shortly after.

This wonderful, 12,000 square foot project is supported by a \$731,000 grant from the New Jersey Green Acres program and is designed specifically to ensure that children of all abilities have a safe, vibrant space to play together.

This facility will feature a two-story play structure specifically designed for children ages five to twelve that is fully wheelchair accessible. For younger visitors, a specialized area for two-to-five-year-olds will be included, ensuring that the park grows with the children who use it.

Beyond just slides and climbing frames, the playground will be a sensory-rich environment. Plans include an inclusive seesaw, a percussion play area where kids can make music, and sensory walls that provide different tactile experiences.



The swing set will also be inclusive, with a "Zero-G" chair to provide extra support for children who need it.

The ground will feature a "pour-in-place" rubberized surface designed to be smooth for wheelchairs and strollers while allowing rainwater to drain directly through it, keeping the area dry and usable shortly after a storm.

Parking at the site will also be expanded, including multiple dedicated ADA spots.

In the future, the project will also benefit from planned construction of permanent, accessible bathroom facilities, which will be a major upgrade from the temporary options currently available at the site.

The inspiration for the project stems from the original Jake's Place in Cherry Hill, which has become a beloved community hub. In the years since its inception, these spaces have provided a unique joy, allowing children who might otherwise be sidelined to interact fully with their peers.

The phone number is answered by Burlington County Central Communications personnel after-hours, weekends, and holidays. The call-taker will connect you to one of our officers.
- The agency offers a Confidential Phone Tip-Line for sharing non-emergent information anonymously at 856-983-4699.
- The agency offers a confidential texting tip service through Tip411. Information can be shared anonymously by texting the letters "ETPD TIP" to 847411 on any mobile device.

## Evesham Police Department Achieves Dual Accreditation with C.A.L.E.A. and NJSACOP

The Evesham Township Police Department reached a significant milestone in law enforcement excellence in late 2025, securing reaccreditation from both the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) and the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police (NJSACOP).

These achievements place the department in an elite tier of law enforcement; Evesham is one of only four municipal police agencies in the entire state of New Jersey to hold both of these prestigious credentials simultaneously.

### What is Accreditation?

Accreditation is a rigorous, voluntary process where a police department invites outside experts to examine every aspect of its operations. To earn these certificates, the Evesham Police Department had to prove its adherence to hundreds of professional standards covering training, use of force, evidence handling, and community engagement.

**NJSACOP Reaccreditation:** This state-level honor ensures the department meets the specific, high-standard legal and operational requirements for New Jersey law enforcement.

**CALEA Reaccreditation:** This national-level award represents the "gold standard" of public safety. Evesham earned this status "With Excellence," a distinction reserved for agencies that go above and beyond basic requirements to demonstrate exceptional professionalism.



While these awards are presented at hearings—ranging from South Brunswick to as far as Jacksonville, Florida—the true impact is felt right here at home.

By meeting these strict national and state standards, the Evesham Police Department ensures greater accountability, transparency, and operational excellence. It signifies a commitment to modern policing practices that prioritize public safety and community trust.

The achievement did not go unnoticed by state and federal representatives. Assemblywoman Andrea Katz and Congressman Herb Conaway have issued formal proclamations for our officers and department, recognizing the hard work and dedication required to maintain this level of service.

For the residents of Evesham, these certifications serve as a guarantee that their local police department remains dedicated to upholding the highest possible standards in the profession.

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

### Pools and Permits (Pop Up/Intex)

**Pool season is just around the corner. Did you know that pop up pools (commonly sold under the Intex brand) or any above ground pool designed to hold 2 feet of water or more require both Zoning and Construction Permits?**

1. A Zoning Permit is required to verify location of the pool.
2. A Construction Permit is required to verify safety including proper pool barrier (locking ladder or fence) and proper electrical connections.
3. If the pool will be removed over the winter months with the intent of reinstalling at a later date, this must be noted on the Zoning Permit application. If the pool is removed and replaced (in the same location), please note that prior to reinstallation a new Construction Permit for the barrier must be submitted and approved by the Township.

### Before You Sell Your Property

**Are you considering selling your home in the future? Before listing your home for sale, the Construction and Zoning Office encourages residents to check to make sure that there are no open Uniform Construction Code permits or permit applications for the property. Inspections are easy to schedule via email or online.**

For your convenience, did you know that you can check online to see permit history on your property? Visit the Township website at [www.evesham-nj.org](http://www.evesham-nj.org) and select "Sign In" to register. Once registered you may check the status of a property on the Township SDL Portal.

## Maintaining Our Neighborhoods: A Quick Guide to Lawn Care Standards

As we begin to enjoy the warmer months ahead in Evesham, we all want to keep our neighborhoods looking their best. To help maintain the beauty and safety of our community, residents are encouraged to be mindful of local property maintenance standards.

Per Chapter 54 of the Evesham Township Code, properties located within 200 feet of any residential building must keep grass and weeds at a manageable height. Specifically, it is considered a violation if overgrown grass on a property exceeds six inches in height.

If you believe a property has become overgrown, you can report the issue directly through Evesham's Online Reporting System at [If.evesham-nj.gov/Forms/ReportAnIssue](http://If.evesham-nj.gov/Forms/ReportAnIssue).

Once a report is made, the township will conduct an inspection. If the property is found to be in violation of Chapter 54, a notice will be sent to the owner, who will then have 10 days to bring the lawn into compliance.

Please be aware that failure to address the violation within the 10-day window may result in further action, including referral to Municipal Court. In addition, failure to comply will cause the Township of Evesham to accomplish the removal and assess the cost thereof against the lands in violation.

### CURBSIDE TREES

Property owners are responsible for the maintenance and/or removal of curbside trees. The Evesham Department of Public Works (DPW) will remove a curbside tree only when it is deemed a hazard to public safety, such as a dead or failing tree.

When a curbside tree is lifting or damaging a sidewalk and creating a tripping hazard, the Township offers a Shared Service Program. Under this program, the Township will incur the cost of removing the tree, stump, and affected roots, provided the property owner agrees to replace the sidewalk with new concrete at their own expense.

Tree removals are scheduled seasonally throughout the Spring, Summer, and Fall, and trees will be addressed during these periods as scheduling and budget permit. If a condition cannot wait until the next scheduled removal period, homeowners may, at their own expense, arrange for the removal of dead trees or trees whose roots are damaging sidewalks. In such cases, the homeowner must obtain a Road Opening Permit prior to the work being performed.

## REVIEW COLLECTION GUIDELINES FOR SPRING CLEANUP

Get ready for some spring cleaning! Evesham Township is preparing for our annual Spring Clean-Up collection, which will once again be focused on the collection of leaves and brush that residents have produced from routine maintenance of their yards.

Specific dates for this year's township-wide collection will be announced soon through our website and social media, but in the meantime, residents can prepare by reviewing the guidelines listed below.

### Requirements for Collection

To ensure your materials are picked up, please place items curbside (not in the street) at the appropriate time and adhere to the following safety and weight regulations:

- **Separation:** During collection time, residents are asked to keep leaves and brush in separate piles. Please do not mix these materials, as they are processed differently.
- **Preparation:** Brush must be cut and tied into four-foot lengths or placed in round cans.
- **Weight Limit:** Tied bundles must not exceed 40 pounds.
- **Residential Only:** DPW does not collect materials from landscapers, developers, or commercial businesses.
- **Exclusions:** The township does not collect grass clippings or weeds.

Outside of the annual Spring Clean-Up event, the township also provides curbside collection for residential tree limbs, branches, stumps, and bushes. To utilize this year-round service, residents must schedule an appointment.

## LEARN ABOUT EVESHAM TOWNSHIP'S "NO KNOCK" REGISTRY

Evesham Township residents have the opportunity to stop solicitors from showing up at their doorstep by taking advantage of Evesham Township's "No Knock" Registry.

Residents can download an application form from the township's website and physically return it to the Township Clerk's Office to receive a special "non-solicitation" sticker.

Residents can then place the sticker in an area of their property visible to the public to give notice that solicitors are

not permitted to knock on their door. Any solicitor found to have solicited at a residence with one of these stickers will be in direct violation of the township's ordinance.

Burlington County is teaming with Evesham Township and the New Jersey Conservation Foundation to protect an ecologically-sensitive property next to the Black Run Preserve.

The Burlington County Commissioners recently voted to adopt a resolution authorizing a cost-share partnership with the township and nonprofit group to preserve the 835-acre Samost property.

Located between Kettle Run, Tomlinson Mill, Kenilworth and Egret roads in Evesham, the property is part of the New Jersey Pinelands and the source of the Black Run, an important freshwater tributary that feeds into the southwest branch of the Rancocas Creek. The property also has critical habitat for numerous native species, including the threatened Pinelands tree frog.

"Burlington County values our natural environment and it's become more important than ever to preserve our green open spaces for current and future generations," said Burlington County Commissioner Director Dr. Felicia Hopson. "Preserving the Samost property will protect an important water source and critical habitat for Pinelands plants and animals. It will expand Evesham's Black Run Preserve and provide additional opportunities for residents and visitors to enjoy passive outdoor recreation in the Pines."

The New Jersey Conservation Foundation is a private, nonprofit organization dedicated to preserving land and protecting natural resources throughout New Jersey. Since 1960, the organization has helped preserve more than 140,000 acres of open space, farmland and parks, and it manages more than a dozen nature preserves, including the 9,400-

acre Franklin Parker Preserve in Tabernacle and Woodland Township.

The organization has been interested in preserving the Samost property for over a decade and is hopeful the support offered by Burlington County and Evesham will allow it to reach a purchase agreement with the land's owners.

Burlington County's resolution authorizes up to \$5 million of County open space funds for the proposed purchase.

"Thanks to early funding commitments, like this one from Burlington County, we are very optimistic that we will be able to move toward reaching an agreement with the landowner," said Robyn Jeney, New Jersey Conservation Foundation's South Jersey Regional Manager. "We are so grateful to our partners and supporters who have rallied to protect this ecologically important property. Here's to continuing this momentum with the goal of ensuring these 835 forested acres remain open space for generations to come."

Evesham leaders strongly support preserving the land and say the town has offered to take responsibility for cleanup and stewardship of the property. The township already maintains the adjacent 1,300-acre Black Run Preserve. Acquisition of the Samost property will create a preserve of over 2,000 contiguous acres, one of the single largest parcels of locally preserved open space in Burlington County.

"The Black Run Preserve is an environmental treasure enjoyed by Evesham residents and visitors from across Burlington County and South Jersey. We take the responsibility of being good stewards of the land very seriously and we are committed to extending the same devotion and care to the Samost property's unique and special landscape," said Mayor Jaclyn Veasy.

"We recognize the importance of this property and the potential harm that any kind of substantial development might cause," added Deputy Mayor Heather Cooper. "We want to eliminate this threat and ensure this land is protected now and forever."

"This is a large piece of property that is among the most environmentally-precious in the region," said Evesham Councilwoman Dr. Krystal Hunter, the Council liaison to the township's Environmental Commission. "Permanently preserving this property is the best way to protect it and keep it natural for current and future generations to enjoy."

## SUSTAINABLE JERSEY CERTIFICATION

Evesham Township is proud to announce that the municipality has officially achieved Silver-level Certification through Sustainable Jersey – the nonprofit organization that provides tools, training, and financial incentives to support communities as they pursue sustainability programs.

This Silver Certification recognizes the township's continuing commitment to sustainability, resource management, and the well-being of its residents. The achievement places Evesham among other New Jersey municipalities working to build a more resilient and prosperous community through environmental stewardship.

Sustainable Jersey's voluntary certification program offers a sustainability roadmap for municipalities, with nearly 150 action items that towns can potentially complete to earn points and achieve certification.

Participation provides a clear pathway for local governments to address critical issues such as climate change, waste reduction, and public health. The program's strategic actions can also lead to cost savings, grant opportunities, and enhanced community engagement.

To earn Silver Certification, a municipality must work beyond the threshold for Bronze certification (150 points) and meet a higher point threshold of at least 350 points, which is meant to represent a more broad-based and integrated approach to sustainability.

Evesham Township was able to achieve Silver Certification in September 2025 with 400 approved points, with the status to be recognized for the next three years.

"Achieving Silver Certification is a powerful statement about our community's values," Mayor Jaclyn Veasy said. "It shows that we're not just thinking about today, but that we're actively working to build a better, more sustainable future for our children and generations to come. It's a source of pride to know that Evesham is recognized for our dedication to these critical initiatives. Councilwoman Dr. Krystal Hunter, who serves as Township Council's liaison to both The Green Team and



Environmental Commission, also praised the dedication of all those who worked to make the achievement possible.

"This recognition from Sustainable Jersey is a testament to the incredible, collaborative effort of so many people," Councilwoman Hunter said. "I want to personally thank every member of our Green Team, Environmental Commission, dedicated township staff and many other officials. They put in countless hours of hard work behind the scenes, from brainstorming ideas to meticulously gathering the data needed for our application. 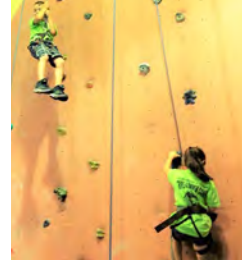

To keep our parks safe and welcoming, we ask all visitors to practice kindness by using polite language and avoiding disorderly behavior. Please help preserve our pristine grounds by disposing of all trash in proper receptacles and parking vehicles strictly in designated areas. And please make sure your pets remain leashed at all times for everyone's safety, while also promptly removing and disposing of all pet waste.

### Prohibited Activities

To prevent accidents and preserve the natural landscape, certain activities and items are strictly prohibited within all Evesham Township municipal parks and open space:

- **Hazardous Items:** Firearms or similar weapons, fireworks, and firecrackers are never permitted.
- **Fire and Air Quality:** Open fires are banned. All parks are also smoke-free environments.
- **Alcohol and Cannabis:** The consumption of alcoholic beverages or cannabis products is prohibited in any park or open space grounds.
- **Wildlife and Environment:** Do not disturb or feed the local wildlife. Additionally, any form of hunting or trapping is prohibited.
- **Equipment and Property:** Vandalizing/defacing of any park equipment, landscaping or other township property is against township rules.
- **Motorized Vehicles & Sport Constraints:** Off-road motorized vehicles are not permitted.
- **Commercial Activity:** The sale of goods or services and the solicitation of funds are generally prohibited within any park, playground or open space.
- **Postings and Advertisements:** Please refrain from hanging or posting signs, placards, or advertisements in any park or open space properties.
- **Golf Activities:** Please remember, any golf activities are prohibited to prevent damage to the turf and ensure the safety of other park guests. Instead, book a tee time at the municipally owned Indian Spring Golf Course or stop by the course Driving Range! Learn more at [www.indianspringgolf.com](http://www.indianspringgolf.com).

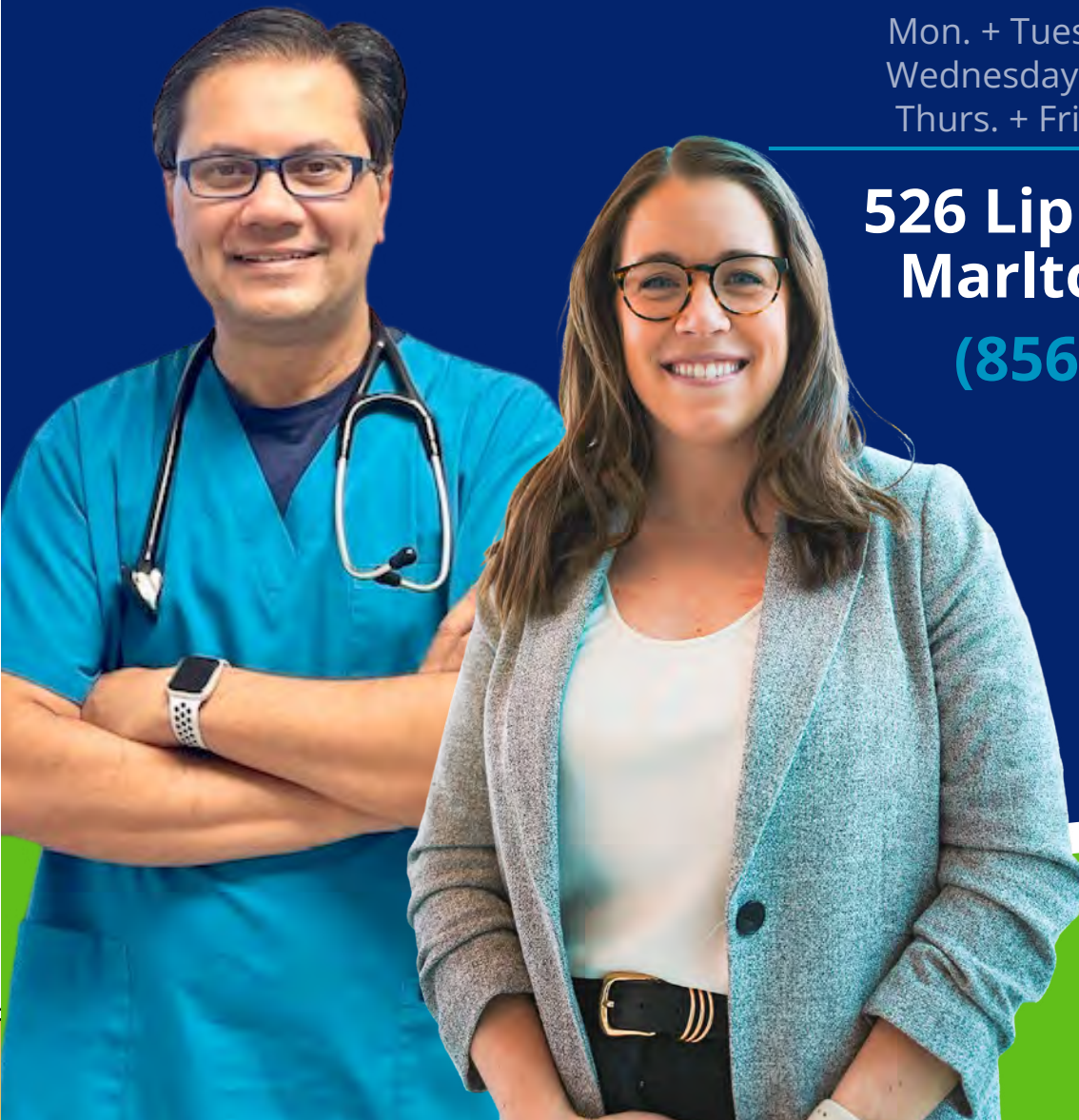

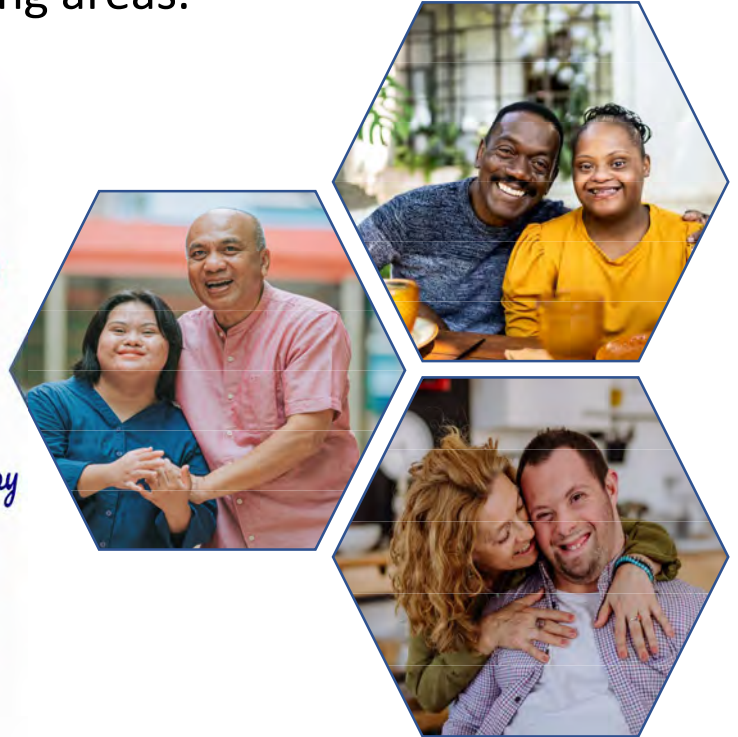

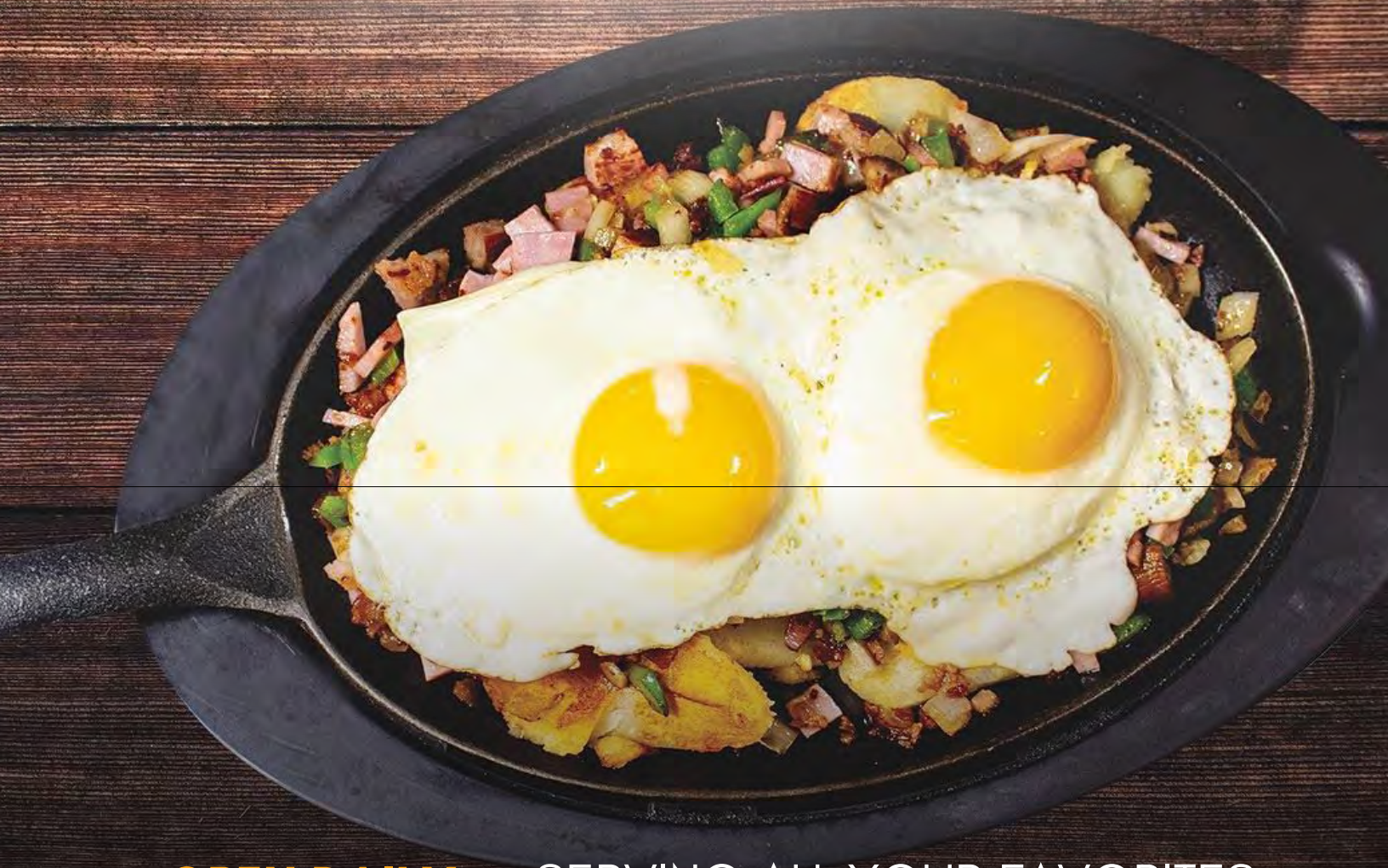
